

Workshop on Teaching/Learning approaches held at North Campus, KU

Srinagar, Feb 03: North Campus, University of Kashmir organized a one-day workshop for aspiring teachers and teaching professionals on “Teaching/Learning Approaches and Methodologies: Current Trends and Practices”.

Director North Campus, Professor Naseer Iqbal inaugurated the workshop and presided over the proceedings of the workshop.

In his inaugural address to the participants, Professor Naseer Iqbal urged the aspirants and teaching professional to “be updated with the current research on teaching/learning with a thorough understanding of the needs of our students and young learners.”
