

## Three-day mentoring workshop on studying abroad concludes at KU



**Srinagar, Aug 31:** A three-day mentoring workshop on 'Studying Abroad' concluded at the University of Kashmir on Wednesday.

The workshop, which was inaugurated by Vice-Chancellor Prof Nilofer Khan, was organised by Centre for Career Planning and Counselling (CCPC) in collaboration with EduAccess, a non-profit initiative working for promotion of higher education.
