

Online refresher course for college, university teachers begins at KU



Srinagar, Dec 24: A two-week refresher course in human rights started at the University of Kashmir.

The online course has been organised for university and college teachers, from within and outside J&K, by the varsity's UGC-Human Resource Development Centre (HRDC).
