

KU holds special function to celebrate Constitution Day

Srinagar, Nov 26: The University of Kashmir on Thursday organised a special function to celebrate the Constitution Day.

Vice-Chancellor Prof Talat Ahmad chaired the function organised by the Department of Law in collaboration with the District Legal Services Authority (DLSA) as part of 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' celebrations.

Addressing students and faculty members on the occasion, Prof Talat said the country's Constitution is not merely a document but a great vision and mission concerning the welfare and betterment of citizens.

He said the Constitution Day—also known as National Law Day—is observed annually on November 26 to commemorate adoption of the Constitution.

and principles in the most honest and truthful manner. He said teachers must make young students understand the Constitution and its salient features which will be a great service to the nation.
