

## KU student group returns from 10-day heritage tour

**Srinagar, Mar 11:** A contingent of students from the University of Kashmir Thursday returned to the campus after their heritage tour to several parts of the country concluded.

The 10-day tour, which was flagged off by Vice-Chancellor Prof Talat Ahmad, was organised by the varsity's Department of Students Welfare (DSW) under the flagship Shikshit Bharat initiative.
