

Seminar on Fundamental Rights & Duties held at North Campus, KU



Srinagar, March 04: Fundamental Rights and Duties Cell of University of Kashmir organized a seminar on the theme of 'Fundamental Rights and Duties' at North Campus KU wherein issues pertaining to rights and duties were deliberated upon by various speakers and experts.
