Youth need to embrace Mahatma's values of justice, peace: VC



Srinagar, Oct 2: To commemorate and honour Mahatma Gandhi's legacy of peace and service, the University of Kashmir (KU) Wednesday organised a series of events to celebrate Gandhi Jayanti, Bapu's birth anniversary here.
