World Elder KU observes Abuse Awareness Day



Srinagar, June 16: To mark the global observance of World Elder Abuse Awareness Day (WEAAD), the Department of Social Work, University of Kashmir (KU), in collaboration with the Centre for Interdisciplinary Studies on Aging (CISA), Moul Mouj Foundation (MMF), Srinagar, organised a day-long programme here at KU main campus on Monday.

Aimed at sensitising people about the rising concerns of elder abuse and the need to safeguard the dignity and rights of older adults the programme was attended by faculty, scholars and students of the campus.

During the programme speakers highlighted the importance of elder care, community responsibility, and policy advocacy in addressing the physical, emotional, and financial abuse often faced by elderly people.

Vice-Chancellor KU, Prof. Nilofer Khan, in her message, highlighted the importance of compassionate elder care and said, "Our elders are the moral anchors of our society. Protecting their dignity and ensuring their safety is not just a legal responsibility but a cultural and emotional one. "Through awareness, research, and outreach, we must strive to make our campuses and communities inclusive and safe for all age groups, especially our senior citizens," he said.
