

KU's North Campus organises panel discussion, film screenings on women's issues



Srinagar, June 16: A panel discussion and film screenings on women's issues drew active participation of students at the North Campus, University of Kashmir.

The events were organised by the Women's Development Cell of the campus to highlight a range of issues that affect women at workplaces, public spaces and elsewhere.
