Training program on psychosocial interventions in drug de-addiction begins at KU

Srinagar, Mar 17: To equip professionals with practical skills in drug de-addiction and psychosocial interventions, the Department of Social Work, University of Kashmir (KU), inaugurated a one-week training program on 'Psychosocial Interventions in Drug De-Addiction.' The training is being held under the sponsorship scheme of the Higher Education Department, J&K Government, from March 17 to 21, 2025.#

The program aims to address the growing concern of substance abuse by training participants in evidence-based counselling techniques, community outreach strategies, and intervention methodologies. It includes expert-led sessions, interactive discussions, and practical exposure to enhance hands-on learning.# Speaking at the inaugural session, Vice-Chancellor KU, Prof. Nilofer Khan, emphasized the importance of such initiatives in tackling substance abuse at the grassroots level.#
