Constitution Day Celebrations: Empower youth towards their rights, responsibilities: KU VC

Felicitates intra-dept quiz competition winners



Srinagar, 28 November: To commemorate the adoption of the Constitution of India and to instil values like liberty, equality and fraternity among citizens, the Law Society, School of Law, Kashmir University Tuesday organised an intra-department quiz competition here.

The quiz competition on 'Constitution Day' or 'Samvidhan Divas' served as a platform to reflect on the principles that underline India's governance and legal system.

During the valedictory, Vice Chancellor, Kashmir University, Prof Nilofer Khan said that the day holds immense importance for it marks the adoption of the Constitution of India laying the foundation of a sovereign, socialist, secular and democratic republic that assures citizens justice, equality and liberty while promoting fraternity.

"The constitution is to be adopted in letter and spirit and giving people like Aijaz an opportunity to narrate his journey in itself speaks volumes of what the Constitution of India guarantees its citizens of," he reiterated.

Registrar, Kashmir University, Dr Nisar Ahmad Mir said that this is the right place to make citizens aware of the Constitution and that celebrating the day ensures we understand our rights and duties.
