

KU's CCCP holds orientation program for civil services aspirants

Srinagar, Sept 10: The Centre for Career Counselling, Coaching and Placement (CCCP), University of Kashmir (KU), organised an orientation programme for its new aspirants of the CRISP-2025 batch in collaboration with O2 IAS Academy, Chandigarh, on 'Strategies for Effective CSE Preparation' at the Main Campus.
