

KU champions green tourism: World environment day at Pahalgam highlights sustainable futures



Srinagar, Sept 29: To mark World Environment Day 2025, the Department of Tourism, Hospitality & Leisure Studies (DTHLS), University of Kashmir (KU), in collaboration with the Pahalgam Development Authority and the Pahalgam Trade & Civil Society Alliance, organized a daylong programme at Pahalgam dedicated to sustainable tourism and environmental stewardship.
